1. The best interests of the minor child(ren) will be maintained through the ongoing involvement of both Mother and Father with the child(ren).
2. The best interests of the minor child(ren) also will be maintained by ensuring regular and continuous school attendance and progress for school-age child(ren).
3. Mother and Father agree that each is a fit person to be involved in the parenting of the child(ren).
4. Mother and Father will remain active and involved in parenting the child(ren).
5. The purpose for this Plan is to establish custody, parenting time, and other access arrangements, to determine parenting time to be spent with Mother and Father, and to decide how to deal with any future disagreements between Mother and Father about this Plan.
6. Mother and Father understand that the needs of the child(ren) may change as the child(ren) get(s) older and Mother and Father will interpret and apply this Plan in a way that best serves any changing needs of the child(ren).
7. _____ will have sole legal and sole physical custody of the

child(ren). Legal custody means the authority and responsibility for making fundamental decisions regarding the child(ren)'s welfare, including choices regarding education and health. 12. **Being on Time.** Mother and Father understand that they have the responsibility to be on time. If either parent will be late for some reason, or will be unable to exercise parenting time, such parent will notify the other parent as soon as possible. Mother and Father understand that

fifteen (15) minutes is a reasonable time for a parent to wait in order to pick up or return the child(ren).

13. **Scheduling Activities.** One parent may not plan or schedule activities during the parenting time of the other parent without reasonable notice to **and** consent of the other parent.
14. **Child(ren)'s Events.** Mother and Father will inform each other, reasonably in advance, of all events where a parent may participate in the child(ren)'s activities or events (i.e., school plays, athletic events, teacher conferences, music recitals, and the like). Notice will be provided in such a way that the other parent has the maximum opportunity to attend that activity or event.
15. **Parenting Responsibilities and Cooperation.** The parent with legal and physical custody of the child(ren) (custodial parent) will have the final decision in the choices regarding the child(ren)'s education, religious upbringing and medical needs. Recognizing, however that it is important that both parents participate and cooperate with each other to bring up the child(ren) in a loving, stable environment, the custodial parent will, in an effort to encourage this environment, notify the noncustodial parent at a meaningful time in advance of any decision regarding enrollment in school, the beginning of participation in religious activities, and the beginning of health care involving the child(ren) in order to learn the noncustodial parent's wishes in these matters. Mother and Father will freely discuss these three areas with one another in an effort to reach an agreement on these issues. In the event Mother and Father cannot agree, the custodial parent will have the final decision in these matters.
16. **Parenting Behavior.** The child(ren)'s best interests require the utmost cooperation between Mother and Father. To this end, neither parent will talk badly about or in any way be negative about the other parent in front of the child(ren) or in any activity or communication involving the child(ren). Neither parent will ask about the other's personal affairs through the child(ren). Mother and Father will cooperate with the other, to the fullest extent necessary, in order to encourage a safe, secure, and loving environment for the child(ren).
17. **Access to Information.** Each parent shall continue to have full and equal access to the education and medical records of the minor child(ren). The names of both parents will appear on all school, governmental, law enforcement, medical and health-related records, and both parents will be provided full and equal access to all teachers, government officials and doctors.

18. **Emergency Medical.** Either parent may make emergency decisions affecting the health or safety of the minor child(ren) while the child(ren) is/are in the physical custody of such parent.
19. **Temporary Changes.** Mother and Father can temporarily change the terms of this Plan as long as they both agree to it.
20. **Permanent Changes.** This Plan may be changed by mutual, written agreement of the parents. Mother and Father understand that any permanent changes must be approved by the Court to be binding and enforceable.
21. **Mediation for Future Disputes.** In the event one or both of the parents wish to change the terms of this Plan in the future and the parents are unable to agree on the terms of such change, the parents will attempt to mediate their disagreements.
22. **Notification Requirement for Current and Change of Address and Contact Information.** If there is a change of address or contact information, each parent will notify the other parent by mailing the change of address to the last known mailing address. Exception: If one parent has a confidential address under Nebraska or federal law, the address or return address shall only include the county and state for a party who is living or moving to an undisclosed location.
23. **Out-of-State Change of Residence.** The child(ren)'s residence will not be changed from the State of Nebraska without prior order of the Court.
